

HOW TO REACH SINTRA

By car

You can reach Sintra using the IC 19 (from Lisbon), the IC 30 (from Mafra), the EN 9 (by A5/Cascais) or even through the A16.

Parking: Sintra has six car parks at your disposal. More information: https://parking.sintra.pt/index_en.html

The town of Sintra has reserved areas with paid parking on public roads. These areas are properly marked. To validate parking, you must purchase the corresponding parking meter ticket.

You can also use the car park of Portela de Sintra (24 Hours). This park is connected by bus and train. The maximum value/day is € 1.50 (VAT Included).

By train

From Lisbon to Sintra, trains depart regularly from Rossio train station (in the historical city center) or Oriente train station.

The trip lasts 40/45 minutes.

By plane

From Lisbon-Portela Airport, you can take the metro (red line) to Oriente train station, then the Oriente-Sintra train.
